GENERAL:

- All articles for exhibit in this class must be the handiwork of the exhibitor. All quilts must be quilted by hand (HQ), machine (MQ) or both. MQ must state "Domestic" or "Long Arm" on extra tag. Quilting is defined as a running stitch that passes through top, batting and backing. Tied quilts are not eligible.
- 2. Items quilted by another person, include that person's name in the Description area of the entry form.
- 3. Items must be completed after August 2015 and may not be submitted more than twice for judging.
- 4. All items must be in good condition and clean. Quilts must be free of any odours such as tobacco, perfume, mildew, pet incomplete, soiled, stained or damaged quilts will NOT be judged.
- 5. Exhibitor may only make one entry per section.
- 6. All decisions of judge(s) are final. Committee reserves the right to reject any entry or to move a quilt into a different category. Quilts are judged on general appearance, design and workmanship in accordance with the OAAS Judging Standards.
- 7. Champion and Reserve Champion Rosettes will be awarded for to those quilts judged to be superior in general appearance, design and workmanship in both Hand Quilting and Machine Quilting. All quilts entered into this class are eligible. A Judge's Choice Rosette will also be available.
- 8. Sample of material must be attached (SMA)

If you are using your own design/pattern, please state design source as original. BEGINNER QUILTS – not less than 40 inches in width. A beginner is defined as any quilter who has been quilting for less than 2 years.

SPECIALTY QUILTING

Prize Money: 1st - \$10.00, 2nd - \$8.00, 3rd - \$6.00

- Art/Landscape Quilt may use several techniques, but must be the entrant's original design HQ or MQ Sponsored by Upper Canada Quilters Guild Prize money: 1st \$18.00, 2nd \$12.00, 3rd \$8.00.
- 40. Novelty Quilt any technique not previously listed, such as, but not limited to: Yo-Yo, Tied, Photo, Wholecloth HQ or MQ
- 41. Table runner, any technique HQ or MQ Sponsored by Giroux Sewing Centre Prize money: 1st \$25.00 Gift Certificate, 2nd \$15.00 Gift Certificate, 3rd \$10.00 Gift Certificate.
- 42. Cushion, not larger than 24 inches on any side HQ or MQ
- 43. Placemat (2), any technique HQ or MQ
- 44. Quilt block, mounted on bristol board, back of block to be accessible

OAAS ELIGIBILITY, RULES AND REGULATIONS

Machine Quilting

General Conditions

- A. Quilt must be solely made and machine quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) fair to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Quilt to be measured on the perimeter. Total perimeter measurement to be a minimum of 324 inches. Note the quilt can be square, rectangular, etc.
- C. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Machine Quilted Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- D. Upon making entry into the OAAS Machine Quilting Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- E. The winning OAAS Machine Quilted Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or OAAS Provincial competition.
- F. The winner's name to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- G. Quilt must have visible machine quilting.

Hand Quilting

General Conditions

- A. Entries must be solely made and hand quilted by the exhibitor and exhibited and judged at a local Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) to be eligible for this competition.
- B. Entry quilts must be a minimum of 324" measured on the perimeter (smaller quilts will not be eligible to proceed to the next level of competition)
- C. The winner's name and pattern to be displayed at the Fair on sign provided by OAAS.
- D. Judging will occur at local fairs and district levels. A Provincial Grand Champion Quilt will be selected at the Annual OAAS Convention.
- E. Upon making an entry into the Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Quilt Competition, the Exhibitor agrees to participate in any promotional activities related to the competition.
- F. The winning Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies Champion Quilt will not be eligible to compete in any future District and/or Convention OAAS competition.
